This year saw the retirement of our President, Barbara Wing after many years of wise and experienced counsel. We welcome our new President, Janette Walls and look forward to working with her in the future.




Faurefold has had another good year with almost 2,200 visitors, 90 bookings of the building and 5 camps.

Training

The current training programme ensures that the leaders are up to date with first aid, GO!, Join Us, Leadership and many other initiatives within Girlguiding. The outdoor team continue to deliver training to assist leaders to gain qualifications for unit residential.

The training programme is designed to train adult leaders, young leaders (14 to 25 years old) and senior patrol leaders (12+) in the skills and knowledge they require to deliver the unit programme. Evening trainings are held to support new leaders in the understanding of their section programme and to continue to offer ideas for use in their unit meetings. These sessions also concentrate on the basic leadership and core skills.

Financial Review

Total incoming resources amounted to £92,534 compared to £108,688 in 2014. Our sources of income are from subscriptions, charges for activities, grants, donations & fund raising. Resources used totalled £45,884 compared to £48,339 in 2014. The main areas of expense are training, costs of activities, grants made and administration. Administrative expenses amounted to £11,753 (2014: £11,237). Net incoming resources were £46,650 (2014: £60,349), which increased the total funds of the County to £217,967 from £171,317. Of the total, £151,408 (2014: £101,102) was held in respect of the Faurefold campsite improvement project. Other restricted and earmarked funds came to £13,382 leaving £53,177 (2014: £52,200) in the general fund. funds are largely held as cash on deposit and cash at bank.
