The Royal British Legion



We have teamed up with the Royal British Legion to help mark Remembrance Day. The Royal British Legion is a charity which provides care and support to the Armed Forces community past and present, and their families. The charity is well known for the annual Poppy Appeal and its red poppy emblem. Their aims are to make sure the memories of those who have sacrificed live on through the generations and to help the British Armed Forces, veterans and their families have a more hopeful future.

This year our range features golondrinas - or swallows. 'Golondrina' was a name given to Guides who arrived as refugees from Europe during the Second World War. The name was coined in the hope that these girls, much like the birds who visit in the summer before travelling back to Europe, would also be able to fly home to freedom.

The range includes <u>woven</u> and <u>metal</u> badges, a <u>candle</u>, <u>charm keyring</u> and a <u>pen</u>.



Update from Guiding HQ on 1st Response Courses



Some changes have been made and include:

1. The training has been split into 3 different sections and can be delivered as a full 6-hour course or it can be split into 3 x 2-hour sessions to allow for greater flexibility. 1st Response can be delivered both in-person and virtually using an online platform

The three sessions are:

- Life Support
- Trauma and Injury
- Major Illness
- 2. There will additionally be new e-learning that will need to be completed alongside the training course. This e-learning will cover the Girlguiding specific areas around policies and procedures, accident reporting and care plans. This is a short e-learning that will take around 10-15 minutes to complete
- 3. We have removed the 2-hour refresher course as an option and will require those who wish to renew their 1st Response after 3 years to complete the full course. This decision has been made to maintain the high level of health and safety standards we have at Girlguiding to keep all our members safe.

These changes have allowed us to provide an updated training which considers first aid changes and recommendations during Covid-19 alongside the other changes and updates we wanted to make. We always needed to provide this training virtually for our members, and we wanted to do this with the revised content and produce something that is relevant now and in the future.

100% of volunteers need to have the correct level of A Safe Space training by the end of December 2020. It looks like it's going to be a chilly, wet weekend so why not spend a few minutes doing your <u>Level 1</u> & <u>Level 2</u>, or finding a Level 3 & level 4 session that suits your schedule on our website?

Level 1 & Level 2 can be done online, and each module takes no more than 20 minutes. If you need to do your Safe Space Level 3 & 4, check our website for upcoming dates. This will be updated regularly.


Nurturing Shy Kids Free Workshop
