Changes to First Response Training

From 1st April Girlguiding is changing the way first response courses are delivered. It still has three distinct sessions to be completed plus the e learning but all of session 1 must now be delivered face to face only. Ideally you should complete session1 before attending other sessions as this gives you the basic approach to all situations. All elements of the course (the three sessions and e learning) must be completed within a 3 month time period. You can of course complete all except the e-learning on a full day face to face session. Places are limited on courses so please book in early and please let us know if you need to cancel so that someone else may be offered the place.


The e-learning part can be found on the Girlguiding learning platform, under Find Learning - it is the very first item listed.

Those who have not completed their face to face session following their online course is urged to identify themselves urgently to surreyeastggfirstresponse@gmail.com so that their training can be completed before 1st April and still be counted.

Anyone already booked into the course of 15th and 29th March and 5th April can complete under the pre-1st April conditions but should try to arrange the face -to-face part as soon as possible.
