Email address

All adult members must have a working email address that only they can access. Adult members policy | Girlguiding. This means that you cannot share emails even if you are related. This is because we are using email for our membership system GO and the Learning Development Platform. It is also used to send essential information and reminders to renew mandatory training. If you currently share an email, please setup a new one and update Go.

Marketing preferences

You can update your marketing preference yourself in Go to opt in or out of marketing emails. To do this, log into Go, and select your name from the top right corner. The bottom option is Marketing Preference.
