Did you know?

DofE Volunteers

Did you know that if a Guide would like to use 'helping at Rainbows or Brownies' for volunteering as part of the Duke of Edinburgh scheme, she does not need to register as a new volunteer? As active members already, she can simply be added by the unit leader to the relevant unit as a Rainbow or Brownie Helper using her membership number.

There is a <u>new starter form (14-17)</u> that needs to be completed by the parents of anyone starting a new role at 14 such as Rangers, Young leader, Peer Educator, Advocates and DofE volunteer. Anyone who is new to Guiding will need to register either as a <u>young member</u> or an <u>adult member</u>.

Safe Space for Under 18s

There is safe space training for young volunteers in leadership roles - <u>A Safe Space for under 18s</u> <u>Girlguiding</u> with an activity pack for Rainbow/Brownie Helpers or Guiding doing their Camp Permit and a Safe Space e-learning for 14-17 year olds.

Unit Capacity

We have updated the unit capacity on GO for several units that had nothing shown. The Unit information is used by prospective parents when they apply to the waiting list so they can see when you meet, how many places are available and if you have a waiting list, how long is it.

Information and Consent

It is important that you use current forms as they are frequently updated, so please download the latest <u>Information and Consent form</u> the website dated 2022. To make it easier for you and your parents, please remember that you can put multiple events onto the same form simply by showing the detail in the Additional Information box. You may also like to ask parents to simply cross out any events listed that they do not consent to or add a checkbox for them to tick to show their support. If it's a more adventurous event, you may choose to have a separate form.

Unit Accounts

At the end of each financial year, unit accounts must be independently reviewed and there is a <u>checklist</u> to support this. Girlguiding need accounts to be sent to your commissioner within 3 months of the end of the financial year. For more information refer to the website <u>End of year accounts | Girlguiding</u>
