Did you know?

Getting set for the new term:

All units must have at least one leader with a safe space level 3, and at least one with first aid training. In practice, we'd recommend that more than one leader hold these qualifications, so they're still compliant if a particular leader can't attend.

If you have completed your safe space 3 before, you can now renew via e-learning on the learning platform. Anyone completing it for the first time, must attend a webinar or face to face training.

Annuals subs/budgeting:

We already know that annual subs for 2024 will be £42 plus whatever levy amount County, Division and Districts apply. Please do ensure unit leaders/treasurers are <u>budgeting effectively</u> and are ready to be able to pay the annual membership fee next February.

Young Leaders/DofE volunteers

Please ensure that they complete the appropriate <u>new starter form</u> and are registered on GO within the first 2-3 weeks of joining.

Why not have a photography evening and select the best photos for the competition?

Rules:

- Open to units and all members and recognised volunteers in girlguiding Surrey East.
- Photos must be originals that you have taken.
- Young members (under 18) must submit their photos via their leaders or local commissioner to ensure appropriate written consent has been obtained. It is recommended that units select their favourite images to enter one or more of the categories.
- When photographing children and young people under the age of 18, leaders need to get written consent from their parent or carer. This should be noted on their membership record on Go 'Photos/videos can be shared and published and used for marketing'. Ask the girls as well for their permission when taking photos of them.
- For adult members (18+) obtain their permission too, and ensure they update their membership record on Go as above to given permission for the photo to be shared and published and used for marketing.
- Images should comply with the <u>girlguiding photography principles</u>. They should feel colourful and bright as we're a vibrant youth brand.

Please submit your entries via the <u>Photography submission form</u>. The closing date will be **Friday 20th October 2023**. The winning photos will be used to promote guiding in Surrey East.
